However, John's vision and drive moved him from newspapers to be involved in numerous endeavors and ventures such as: concert promotions, co-owner of the Lansing All Stars semi-pro football team, he was an indoor sun tanning pioneer and formed the company TanFaster, owned Metro Ice Arena in Lansing that hosted the Lansing Lancers, he developed racquetball facilities, owned and operated Sub Villa restaurants. Most recently many people would recognize him as "Captain John" owner of J & K Steamboat Company. John was an avid sailor and snow skier and enjoyed being active in Grand Ledge, the community where he lived and operated J & K. He is survived by his wife of over 35 years Karla (Mathiasen); children, Christopher and Laura Chamberlain; mother, Jean; brother, James (Sandy) Chamberlain; sister, Julie (Tony) Foust; niece, Danielle (Dustin) Derethik, nephews, Blair Foust and Allen (Dana) Mackey, and sister-in-law Karen Mathiasen.
