Frank D. McCullough of Harrsion formerly of Grand Ledge passed away at his home surrounded by his loving family. Frank was born October 13, 1920 in Lansing, Michigan to the late Charles and Georgette (Viane) McCullough. Frank proudly served his country in the United States Navy during WW II and worked for Crandell Brothers Trucking Co. in Charlotte during the 1950's and helped with the construction of the Mackinaw Bridge. Frank also worked for the John Bean Co. but ultimately spent most of his career with Delta Charter Township, retiring after many years of service. He was a skilled craftsman and enjoyed woodworking and home building. Frank also enjoyed fishing, tinkering on cars and loved his cats and Pomeranian dog, Coco Bean.
