“ Quite a few years ago when my parents lived in Ludington, John and I visited them to go out on Lake Michigan salmon fishing on my Dads boat. After a few hours while I was standing near the back of the boat one of the lines we had out on a down-rigger, sprung up after a salmon had hit the lure. As was our custom we had drawn names to set the order of who was next in line to try to land the fish. In this case, John was next but since I was right next to the pole with the fish on I grabbed it and set the hook. I then turned to John and gave him the pole. I knew when I had the pole that it was a big one. John had just lit up his pipe when I handed him the pole and he was obviously very surprised at how strong the fish was and how hard it was pulling on the line. John fought that fish for more than 20 minutes as he reeled the fish in and it would take off again but we finally landed it. It was a big King, it weighed just over 27 pounds. Johns first salmon was huge! Once we got the fish into our cooler John had a chance to take that pipe out of his mouth and said "Look at that! I almost bit the end of my pipe off while I was fighting that monster!" The pipe bit was almost chomped in two. That day turned out to be one of to most productive fishing trips we ever had and it all started with the big one that John caught.
