



Thomas Boyd Hamilton

Thomas Boyd Hamilton, a beloved lifelong resident of Grand Ledge, Michigan, passed away peacefully at home on February 13, 2026, surrounded by his loving family. Born on December 27, 1934, in Mason, Michigan, he was the cherished son of the late John F. and Burnidean V. (De Pugh) Hamilton. Tom graduated with pride from Grand Ledge High School in the Class of 1953, where he was honored to serve as Homecoming King.

A dedicated patriot, Tom proudly served his country in the United States Army from March 1955 to March 1957, attaining the rank of Private First Class. He embraced many roles throughout his life, working for General Motors as a Supervisor in Material Handling, where his commitment and expertise were truly valued.

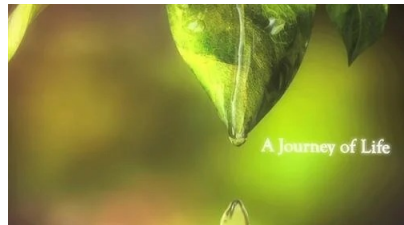

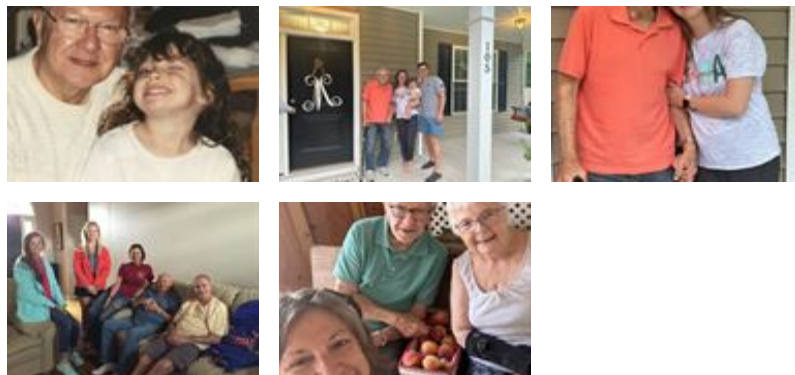

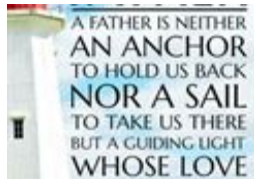
